Llonia L. Rojan Jackson, LMSW, serves as Director of Cultural Diversity and Belonging at the University of Hartford in West Hartford, CT. In her role, she spearheads deliberate Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, Justice, and Belonging (DEIJB) initiatives aimed at fostering an inclusive environment conducive to student learning and success.

Among her notable achievements is the expansion of the Black Student Union (BSU) Book Fund into a scholarship program, offering vital support to students experiencing financial difficulties. Under her stewardship, the fund garnered over \$16,000 in its initial six months.

Llonia's commitment to student engagement and inclusivity transcends her current role, having held pivotal positions such as Director of Student Engagement and Inclusion, Director of Multicultural Programs, and Associate Director of Alumni Engagement within the university.

Additionally, Llonia plays a pivotal role as an instructor in the Success Team for Readiness, Improvement, Diversity, and Excellence (STRIDE) program. Through mentorship and strategic guidance, she supports the academic and personal success of Black/African American and Hispanic/Latinx students, ensuring they thrive both academically and personally throughout their college journey.

Llonia's commitment to education and community extends to her involvement as an adjunct professor in the University Interdisciplinary Studies program at the University of Hartford, as well as her previous teaching roles at the University of Connecticut and Adelphi University's School of Social Work.

Before joining the University of Hartford, Llonia held the position of Assistant Director of Field Education at Adelphi University, where she oversaw the Master of Social Work Field Education program at the Hudson Valley Center. With a rich professional background spanning academia, nonprofits, government, and community relations, Llonia brings a wealth of experience to her current role.

As a proud alumna of the University of Hartford, Llonia holds a master's degree in social work from the University of Connecticut and a bachelor's degree in philosophy and political science from her alma mater. She is a Licensed Master Social Worker and actively participates as a speaker and panelist on DEIJB, women's initiatives, student engagement, and higher education topics.

In recognition of her exceptional contributions, Llonia was awarded the Martin Luther King Jr. Beloved Community Award by the University of Hartford in February 2022. Additionally, she is deeply engaged with the Theta Alpha Sigma Alumnae Chapter of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc., where she serves as the scholarship chair.

Outside her professional pursuits, **Llonia is deeply rooted in her faith community, having joined Faith Congregational Church in 2007 and later ordained as a Deacon in 2015.** She takes pride in her role as Deacon Lead, having previously taught in the church school and supported the Nursery.

Llonia is a devoted mother to her children, Yannick and EmmiSoleil, and resides in WestHartford, where she continues to be a catalyst for positive change within her community and beyond.
